RE: Understanding Your Student's 2016 PARCC Scores

Dear Parent/Guardian:

This past spring, your student participated in the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) tests to measure his or her academic progress with the New Jersey Student Learning Standards. Evaluating the results from PARCC testing can be a helpful tool in measuring your student's success in school, and it is just one of the many ways your student's teachers and administrators can determine whether he or she is on track to being college- and career-ready. New Jersey has had statewide tests for decades, and they have served as a small, but important part of assessing our students' annual progress.

The Individual Student Reports you will soon receive in September have been improved based upon feedback from parents and educators. You will receive an individual score report in each PARCC subject that your student was enrolled in for English language arts and mathematics. A written explanation indicates where your student is doing well and where he or she may need additional help. There are also charts and graphics that show you how well your student is performing in relation to the New Jersey Student Learning Standards (www.state.nj.us/education/cccs/), and how your student's performance compares to other students in his or her school, district and state.
